Dear Deputy Cullinane,

The Health Service Executive (HSE) has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question, which you submitted to the Minister for response.

Table 1 below provides the number of persons availing of Older Persons Day Services in the format requested. Please also note that due to differences in data collection practise in individual CHO areas, not all areas were able to provide this information as requested and so the below only gives a partial picture of the numbers requested. Areas which could not send a return have been indicated by N/A.

Note this information is not available for Disability Services, though we can say that the Service Quantum Reports indicate that since day service locations reopened in August 2020, there has been a steady increase in the quantum of service being provided to day service users. This increased from an average of 30% in August 2020 to current day average of 60%.
