To ask the Minister for Health the estimated cost of increasing community paramedicine resources by 5%; the staffing composition of current community paramedicine; and if he will make a statement on the matter.

PQ 43092/21

To ask the Minister for Health the reason the National Ambulance Service does not recognise intermediate care operatives as ambulance personnel; and if he will make a statement on the matter.

PQ 43093/21

To ask the Minister for Health the reason the National Ambulance Service is asking intermediate care operatives to work on emergency ambulances; and if he will make a statement on the matter.

PQ 43094/21

To ask the Minister for Health the staffing levels of the National Ambulance Service by CHO; the current number of wholetime equivalent posts by occupation currently working; the recommended and budgeted number; and if he will make a statement on the matter.

Dear Deputy Cullinane,

The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Questions, which you submitted to the Minister for Health for responses.

Currently in the National Ambulance Service there are eleven Paramedic/Advanced Paramedics deployed in the role of Community Paramedics across the country.

The Community Paramedic service requires deployment of two to three staff, working collaboratively to ensure the service can be provided across a seven day per week roster. This ensures maximising the positive and sustained impact of the service for the patients assessed and treated by the Community Paramedics.

The cost of increasing the current eleven whole time equivalent (WTE) staff providing the Community Paramedic service by five percent equates to an additional 0.55 WTE of a Community Paramedic (a part-time post equating to an additional circa nineteen hours per week). This would cost circa €35,320 per annum.



There are distinct differences between an Intermediate Care Operative and a Paramedic and an Advanced Paramedic as their have different roles within the National Ambulance Service. An Intermediate Care Operative is tasked with non-critical routine patient transportation which is within their scope of practice as approved by the Pre-Hospital Emergency Care Council (PHECC). These staff complete a relatively short course (within three months) to register with PHECC at this level.

The National Ambulance Service continues to aspire to have two Paramedics as the ideal crewing model for those emergency calls which may require the Paramedic standard of care. In the context of the current public health emergency (COVID-19), the National Ambulance Service has had to focus on achieving the minimum standard, rather than the ideal. In this regard, our trade union partners have been helpful and supportive of our response to the current public health emergency and the protracted nature of the workforce planning challenge it presents.
