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PQ 43366/21* To ask the Minister for Health the number of patients hospitalised following Covid-19 vaccination or hospitalised with suspected adverse reactions to a Covid-19 vaccination; and if he will make a statement on the matter. -Mattie McGrath

Dear Deputy McGrath

The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question, which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response.

Response:

I have been advised by the HSE Special Delivery Unit that as of last Tuesday 20th September 2021, the data collated on 293 patients who were admitted into hospital showed that 59% of patients were fully vaccinated, 39% were not fully vaccinated and 2% vaccination status unknown.

With regard to your question on hospitalisation with suspected adverse reactions to a Covid-19 vaccine a search of the (National Incident Management System) NIMS was undertaken.

Findings - 30 incidents <u>occurring between January and July 2021 were reported</u> involving Service Users or Healthcare Workers who had a suspected adverse drug reaction to a Covid-19 Vaccine that required hospitalisation or an assessment in an ED. This data set includes incidents reported from the following: Private Hospitals, Public hospitals and Covid vaccination centres.

I trust that this is of assistance.
