Dear Deputy Cullinane,

Thank you for your PQ above, which has been forwarded to me for direct reply.

The HSE operates schemes under applicable EU and Irish legislation and/or guidelines from the Department of Health for the funding of healthcare outside the state e.g. the Treatment Abroad Scheme (TAS), the HSE Cross Border Directive, the Northern Ireland Planned Healthcare Scheme, etc.

Access to planned healthcare outside the legislation and guidelines e.g. access to healthcare outside the EU/EEA, Switzerland and the UK, is administered through the office of the TAS using the same criteria etc as applies to applications to the TAS for funding. In general where a treatment or an equivalent treatment is available in Ireland and/or the EU/EEA/Switzerland/UK, such treatment would not be approved for funding outside of the available schemes which have a legislative basis.
