To ask the Minister for Health if he will provide details of the way in which patients are categorised for emergency department admissions; the way these are prioritised; the effect of this prioritisation in practice; the number of patients admitted under each category in 2019, by hospital in tabular form; and if he will make a statement on the matter.

Dear Deputy Cullinane,

The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question, which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response. I have examined the matter and the following outlines the position.

Response:

The National Clinical Programme for Emergency Medicine advises that all patients attending ED are triaged into one of five categories of urgency, in relation to the need for emergency intervention. Approximately 25% of attendances are then referred for inpatient admission.

Following a decision to admit, those patients are further prioritised by the following:

- Need for isolation because of particular diagnosis under consideration
- Level of dependency and treatment needs (e.g. requiring ICU bed)
- Length of stay in the Emergency Department

In addition to the above, special requirements such as the need for cardiac monitoring and non-invasive ventilation are also considered.

Granular data on the number of patients admitted aligned to the above clinical decisions/ prioritisation is not collated. However, 2019 data on the total number of admissions per hospital may be seen in the following table.
