PQ 60641/22: To ask the Minister for Health the number of women and babies who have been discharged into the care of homeless services from maternity hospitals in the past three months; the number that have been discharged from hospital in need of emergency accommodation but with no accommodation to go to; and the number of requests that have been received from social workers in maternity hospitals asking for emergency accommodation support for mothers and babies.

PQ 60642/22: To ask the Minister for Health if there are figures from the maternity hospitals on the number of additional nights that was it necessary for women and newborn children to stay in maternity hospitals due to the mother and child having no accommodation to go to.

Dear Deputy O'Riordan,

The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Representatives Question, which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response. I have examined the matter and the following outlines the position.

The data requested is not collected at national level. It is therefore not possible to prepare a report or make a statement on the matter.

However each maternity service has a social work service for which those requiring particular supports can be referred to. To date NWIHP has funded an additional 20.5 WTE in social work posts across the 6 maternity networks.

I trust this clarifies the matter.
