CHO 4: Response as at 20/12/2022

As part of the response to ongoing Consultant vacancy in Kerry CAMHS, and in line with recommendation 18 of the Maskey report, a very successful telemedicine clinic was established in January 2022.

All children and families are given a choice as to whether they are happy to participate in a telemedicine clinic and are asked prior to the appointments to give their consent. If they do not wish to have a consultation by means of tele-clinic they are offered a face to face consultation with another Consultant as soon as this can be arranged. The team have a standardised operating policy in place to ensure that the tele medicine clinics operate in a clinically safe and effective manner. It is important to note that the children are not being treated in a different country as they present to the team base in Killarney where they are supported by a team member when they meet the Consultant. The Consultant treating the children currently works from Doha and travels to Killarney every 3 months.

Colleagues in Mental Health Services Cork Kerry Community Healthcare have advised that to date, the Consultant has treated 106 children since the clinic commenced and to date the feedback received from young people and their families have been positive.
