The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question (Reference 9790/22), which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response.

The National Assessment Guidelines for persons aged 70 years or older provide for the retention of eligibility, for a maximum of 3 years, in the event of the death of a spouse or partner, subject to certain conditions. Details relating to the retention of eligibility is contained on the second page of the Over 70 Application form.
