The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question (Reference 1352/22), which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response.

A removal of the Prescription Charge for persons aged Over 70 (and their dependents) will result in a cost to the State of c.€25m.

- The following costing will be based on the current Over 70's prescription charge rate of €1.00 per item.
- The costing will be prepared on the assumption that the monthly spend cap will also
- The average number of items per month in 2021 which were attracting a prescription charge is c.4.1m.
- The Pro-rata split between Under 70's and Over 70's is based on claim data received June 2021YTD.
