Question

To ask the Minister for Health the number of contracts for and quantity of antigen tests procured to date or available to be further drawn down; and if he will make a statement on the matter. -David Cullinane

Response

Deputy David Cullinane,

The Health Service Executive (HSE) has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response.

The HSE has purchased 28,157,400 antigen tests since March 2020, to support all antigen test programs. The HSE has purchased antigen test kits (self-tests) from an EU Joint Procurement agreement (JPA) for much of 2021. Ireland was allocated an initial 1.25 million tests from this agreement, and this has been increased at the HSE's request on four separate occasions throughout 2021.

This total allocation of 20.714 million tests more than met the HSE's demand for antigen tests until recently, when the weekly volumes increased by over 500% in two months.

Negotiations have taken place over the last fortnight with potential Suppliers to ensure ongoing supply, and now that the allocation has been exceeded it is intended to conduct a tender for antigen tests in the near future.
