Question: To ask the Minister for Health the arrangements that the HSE has put in place to offer individuals who do not have a PPS number, for whatever reason, a Covid-19 vaccination; and if he will make a statement on the matter.

Dear Deputy Devlin,

I refer to the above Parliamentary Question which has been referred by the Minister for Health to the Health Service Executive for direct response.

In relation to your query regarding vaccination in Ireland, please note that an individual only needs a PPS number to register for their vaccine using the online portal. Any individual who does not have a PPS number, has two options available to them. They can call the HSE Helpline, HSELive on 1800 700 700 between 8am and 8pm to register for an appointment or they can attend a [walk-in clinic](#), where they will not need an appointment. The HSE can register them at the walk-in clinic.

Individuals without a PPSN will need:

- mobile phone number
- email address
- photo ID with date of birth - this can be a passport or driving licence

They will also need proof of address. This can be a:

- household bill
- bank or financial institution statement
- letter from a public service department or agency
- rental agreement
- letter from the owner of the property
- bill or letter from a hotel or Airbnb
