Please note that the HSE does not maintain a vacancy rate and the HSE's recruitment process is informed by its staff group turnover data. Turnover data is calculated based on the numbers of leavers across our services, with resignations, retirements, ending of contracts, and other reasons, including moves to other health sectors employers captured as a leaver from our service. The decision to resign or retire, is often determined by personal decisions. However, in our planning process, we utilise the staff group turnover rate, which is in the order of 6-7% overall, to plan for the replacement of these staff across our services, incorporated into our overall planning for recruitment of not only replacement posts, but equally our new service development posts.
