**PQ 28704/22 – To ask the Minister for Health the details of the authorisation of insulin pumps by CHO and LHO in each of the years 2016 to 2021 in tabular form; and if he will make a statement on the matter.**

Dear Deputy Cullinane,

The Health Service Executive (HSE) has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question (PQ 27156/22) which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response.

I can advise that requests for insulin pumps are received from consultants who are treating patients (adults and children) for Diabetes Mellitus. Requests are approved by the Principal Medical Officer, or a Senior Medical Officer.

Insulin pumps are supplied to eligible patients free of charge. Patients are eligible for this equipment if they hold a Long Term Illness (LTI) card or a Medical Card. All patients with long-term Diabetes Mellitus are eligible for the LTI scheme, regardless of means.

The table below outlines the number of insulin pumps authorised over the requested years.
