## **Dear Deputy Cullinane,**

The Health Service Executive (HSE) has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the following Parliamentary Question, which was submitted to this Department for response.

## PQ 30091/22

To ask the Minister for Health the status of step-down care services by CHO area; the number of step-down beds operational in each CHO area; the step-down facilities currently in operation in each CHO area; and if he will make a statement on the matter. - Catherine Connolly

Step down care facilities are recognised as an important category of Short Stay beds that are designed to meet the specific care needs of the service user whose episode of acute medical/surgical care is complete but who is not as yet ready to be discharged to their place of residence. These beds are available in each of the 9 CHO areas and their use can be interchangeable depending on the demand at any particular time.

Across all CHO areas the management and operation of these beds have been challenged by the surges in Covid-19 outbreaks as well as meeting regulatory compliance under SI 293 regulations.
