PQ 31701/22 - To ask the Minister for Health the number of warnings issued by hospitals advising patients with non-emergency conditions to seek assistance from other parts of the health service and to not attend their emergency department in 2021 and to date in 2022; and if he will make a statement on the matter.

Dear Deputy Cullinane,

The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary question, which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response.

I understand that the specific information which you are requesting is not available.

However, I am advised that the HSE issues public advice on Emergency Departments both nationally and at Hospital Group and Hospital level, as necessary. For example, on Friday, 3rd June 2022, the HSE encouraged the public to help protect our hospitals and emergency departments over the June bank holiday weekend https://www.hse.ie/eng/services/news/media/pressrel/hse-encouraging-the-public-to-help-protect-our-hospitals-and-emergency-departments-over-the-june-bank-holiday-weekend.html
