**PQ34790/22: To ask the Minister for Health the number of scheduled care cancellations for the month of May 2022, by hospital and hospital group in tabular form; and if he will make a statement on the matter.**

**PQ 34791/22: To ask the Minister for Health the number of scheduled care cancellations for the month of May 2022, by hospital and hospital group for each week and each day in tabular form; and if he will make a statement on the matter.**

Dear Deputy Cullinane,

The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question, which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response.

## **Response**

In response to your questions, outlined above, Hospitals and Hospital Groups are working to develop a robust process for the collection and collation of data on cancellations. In this context, the data for April 2022 and May 2022, which relates to hospital initiated cancellations for planned/elective activities is attached. Work is ongoing to validate this data and as such a number of caveats are outlined in Appendix I, below. It should be noted that the data presented may be subject to change in this context.

In relation to your query relating to the number of patients that have experienced a cancellation in the last 6 months for an outpatient, inpatient, or diagnostic appointment; the number of patients where the number of cancellations was greater than 2, 3, 4, and 5 for each, for that appointment, the HSE does not centrally collect or report on the information requested.

- **Definition of a hospital initiated inpatient/day case cancellation**

A hospital initiated cancellation of an inpatient/day case procedure is defined as the rescheduling of a patient To Come In (TCI) date by the hospital due to circumstances beyond its control.

- **Reasons for cancellation of scheduled care appointments**

Hospitals may have to cancel scheduled care appointments due to factors outside their control including the following;

- I. Increased ED attendances and admissions resulting in a requirement for surge inpatient bed capacity
- II. Unforeseen circumstances e.g. Weather events, infection outbreaks or industrial action.

- **Rescheduling hospital appointments**

Hospitals endeavour to provide the patient with as much notice as possible in relation to the cancellation of elective appointments. The National Inpatient, Day Case, Planned Procedure (IDPP) waiting list management protocol 2017 issued by the National Treatment Purchase Fund (NTPF) requires hospitals to reschedule elective care appointments within six weeks of cancellation, subject to patient confirmation regarding their availability to attend. Clinical guidance must be sought when managing and rescheduling patients cancelled by the hospital. This is necessary to ensure that urgent and vulnerable patients are rescheduled appropriately. Patients cancelled by the hospital will not have their waiting list date reset.

I trust that this answers your question.

## Appendix I

1. **St. Luke's Radiation Oncology:** The current process does not allow them to differentiate or omit where the appointment was cancelled for clinical reasons, patients decision. It also includes if an appointment was changed from a virtual to a face to face appointment at the same time. It does not include appointments where patient did not attend, Cancelled – Did not attend. Additionally this includes New and Returning Outpatient Appointments, but does not include chemotherapy and other day cases, they are working on a process to include this data and will update retrospectively if possible.
2. **Hospitals reporting outside data produced:** One hospital has begun reporting data in the period in which this report covers meaning only partial data is available for May, this being:
  - a. St Columcilles HospitalOne hospital has begun reporting outside of the requested reporting dates and as such some this hospitals data will not be shown on this report, this includes:
  - a. National rehab
3. **Non-reporting Hospitals:** A number of hospitals have not begun reporting data due to a variety of reasons including but not limited to data path issues, inability to differentiate reasons for cancellations and Cyber Attack (ongoing issues). These include the below:
  - a. CHI Connolly
  - b. CHI Crumlin
  - c. CHI Temple Street
  - d. National Maternity Hospital
  - e. Bantry
  - f. Mallow
4. **Sporadic Reporting:** Please note that some hospitals may have missed reporting in a given week within the requested reporting period.
