To ask the Minister for Health when in-person psychiatric outpatient appointments will resume with HSE psychiatrists in counties Meath, Westmeath and Louth in view of the fact that only ineffective by phone HSE psychiatric consultations are continuing despite the lifting of restrictions

Dear Deputy Guirke,

The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question, which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response. I have examined the matter and I outline the position as follows.

In relation to Louth Meath Mental Health Services, Face to Face appointments continued with a combined mix of telehealth/video assessment during Covid 19. Appointments were made based on clinical need and taking into consideration client preference. If a client requested a face to face appointment this was/is facilitated. All new patient appointments have been held face to face by all teams since last year.

Within all Community Mental Health clinics in Westmeath, all new and re-referral appointments are taking place in person (face-to-face), unless a service user has a stated preference for virtual appointments.
