PQ Question: To ask the Minister for Health the number of children currently waiting to be seen by child and adolescent primary care psychology services nationally; the average length of time on the wait list; and if he will make a statement on the matter – Verona Murphy

Dear Deputy Murphy,

The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question, which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response. I have examined the matter and the following outlines the position.

The HSE is committed to the provision of evidence based Psychological Interventions for young people. These interventions are delivered internally through Primary Care and where necessary through CAMHS Teams.

In addition significant additional funding has been allocated to NGO's e.g. Jigsaw to improve access to young people seeking Psychological assistance.

Primary Care psychology services work with children with mild-to moderate mental health needs or signposting those who need specialist services. All referrals are prioritised upon receipt. The additional Assistant Psychologist Posts in Primary Care teams will assist in ensuring that young people whose clinical needs are at primary care level are not inappropriately ending up on secondary care waiting lists due to lack of appropriate assessment and resources.

CAMHS is a specialist service that provides assessment and treatment to children and young people who are experiencing moderate to severe mental health difficulties such as anxiety, depression, eating disorders and psychosis. Some conditions treated in CAMHS include: moderate to severe depression, anxiety, eating disorders and self-harm. The CAMHS Standard Operating Procedure outlines for all stakeholders the role and function of CAMHS Teams to ensure only appropriate referrals are made, and to highlight the role of Primary Care in dealing with less severe Mental Health issues.

Mental Health Services do not routinely collect data on wait lists for CAMHS psychology services.
