To ask the Minister for Health the proposals to improve access to services and reduce waiting times for appointments for members of a centre (details supplied) for persons with Downs syndrome in counties Longford and Westmeath; and if he will make a statement on the matter. -Peter Burke

Dear Minister Burke,

The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question, which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response. I have examined the matter and I outline the position as follows.

Currently there are no specific initiatives for any diagnostic group. All services are planned and delivered in line with children's needs and not based on the child's diagnosis.

Access to services and waiting times are currently impacted by staff vacancies and all vacancies are with HSE recruitment. The need for additional resources within the Children's Disability Network Teams (CDNT's) has been escalated with a view to securing additional development posts for the teams in 2022.
