The Cycle to Work Scheme is a tax incentive encouraging employees to cycle to and from work. Under the scheme, employers pay for bicycles and bicycle equipment for their employees. The employee pays their employer back through a salary-sacrifice arrangement. The employee is not liable for tax, PRSI or Universal Social Charge on their repayments.

It is the policy of the HSE to provide facilities at the workplace for staff bicycles.

Over the period 2017-2020, HSE H&W have once-off funding to CHOs and Hospital Groups to support staff health and wellbeing initiatives including the provision of facilities to support active commuting. A recurring staff H&W fund has been established in CHOs and Hospital Groups. Measures to support active commuting continue to be recommended for consideration by CHOs and Hospital Groups including participation in the national Smarter Travel initiative.

The annual HSE Steps to Health campaign includes advice and tips to promote active travel, in 2021 almost 7,000 staff.
