Dear Deputy Cairns,

The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Questions, which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response.

Response:

Recent changes to the internal governance of HSE Homebirth services took place resulting in the transfer of governance from Community Health Organisations (CHOs) to Acute Operations. In this regard, HSE Homebirth services are now governed by Acute Services and this service has been integrated into the present maternity service as per the National Maternity Strategy 2016-2026. Currently, in the order of 28 Self Employed Community Midwives (SECMs) have current MOUs / Agreements with the HSE to provide HSE Homebirth Services across the country. The number of hours worked by each SECM is linked to the number of HSE Homebirths approved at any given time and their (SECM) capacity and availability to provide the service.
