To ask the Minister for Health the level of funding provided for tobacco cessation services from 2011 to 2021 and to date in 2022; and if he will make a statement on the matter.

Dear Deputy O' Reilly,

The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to your above referenced Parliamentary Question, which you submitted to the Minister for Health. The question concerned was referred to Strategy and Research, HSE, for review and direct response as the work of the Tobacco Free Ireland Programme (TFIP) is part of that function.

The TFIP is the HSE vehicle through which the actions identified for the HSE in the Department of Health *Tobacco Free Ireland* Strategy (2013) are implemented across the health services. The Programme falls under the governance of Strategy and Research in the HSE (in 2017 the TFI Programme was part of the former Health and Wellbeing Division of the HSE).

Tobacco cessation measures include; smoking cessation medications provided to medical card holders through the Primary Care Reimbursement Scheme (PCRS), frontline HSE intensive smoking cessation services (staff cost), the National Quitline and mass media (QUIT) campaigns. The quit campaign aims to increase the demand for QUIT support services and National Quitline and medication costs subsequently vary and are demand led.

Our response to the PQ concerned is set out below.

The Department of Health-commissioned report *An Assessment of the Economic Cost of Smoking in Ireland*⁵, published in 2016, estimated the annual cost to the health service as €460 million, and the total annual costs to the state are €10.7 billion. As per the Department of Health commissioned HIQA report, tobacco dependence treatments and associated campaigns are highly cost effective.

¹ The We Can Quit Programme is a peer led, 12-week stop smoking group support programme for disadvantaged communities. There is a new Sláintecare Healthy Communities Programme investment for 2 courses in 19 designated areas and North Inner City Dublin in 2022.

² The PCRS costs for stop smoking medication for medical card holders is a demand led service. We have projected total 2022 costs based on a 5-year average (2017-2021). The estimation provided here is 5 months of this projection.

³ Billing January – April 2022.

⁴ The development of the Sláintecare Healthy Communities and Enhanced Community Care Chronic Disease Programmes have seen investment in new stop smoking services in disadvantaged areas where smoking prevalence continues to be high. The estimated total staff cost for 2022 is € 3,313,068 (5 month estimated staff costs for 2022 provided for this PQ).
