Dear Deputy Ward,

The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question, which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response. I have examined the matter and the following outlines the position.

Irish National mental health policy as reflected in *Sharing the Vision - A Mental Health Policy for Everyone,* has been developed based on a population-planning model, which identifies layers of need. This is addressed by providing: mental health promotion for the general population; self-help resources; people to people supports; primary care and community services; specialist mental health services; and, services for people with complex and enduring needs.

Within this comprehensive framework, supports meeting lower level mental health needs are highly scalable, for example mental health promotion campaigns, online and text-based supports and services such as social prescribing at primary care level. These supports are widely available and targeted at populations across Ireland in both urban and rural settings.

At the level of specialist mental health service delivery, models of care have been developed to respond to clinical need addressing challenging, specialist areas of mental health care, rather than addressing wide population groupings. Specific examples include the areas of eating disorders, psychosis, perinatal mental health and self-harm (including suicide related ideation).
