Dear Deputy Pringle,

The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you with information in the context of the above Parliamentary Question you submitted to the Minister for Health for response. I have examined the matter and the following outlines the position.

There are ongoing and continuous recruitment efforts to fill vacant posts in Ballymun Primary Health Centre and across Community Healthcare Organisation Dublin North City and County (CHO DNCC).

Current Vacancies in Ballymun Primary Health Centre:

Administration	2 WTE (whole time Equivalents) – Post at recruitment
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	stage and start date agreed.
Physiotherapy	2 WTE and 1 WTE Physiotherapy Assistant
Occupational Therapy	2 WTE staff grade- Both posts offered out to panel.
Social Work	No Vacant posts
Dietitian	2 WTE staff grades are both filled
	3 WTE Senior Staff grades unfilled
Speech & Language	Adult
	1 Senior WTE
	Pediatric
	1 Senior WTE
	1 Staff Grade WTE
Nursing	3.8 WTE.

Summary of vacant posts in Ballymun Primary Health Centre:

• New national staff grade Physiotherapy, Occupational Therapist, and Speech & Language Therapist panels formed in November 2022.

• Senior Physiotherapy, Occupational Therapist and Speech & Language Therapist panels are in place and have been recently supplemented with additional recruitment

campaigns to attract new candidates. All vacant posts have been offered out to existing

panels, and will be offered to new panels once formed.

• Dietitian: Staff Grade & Senior panels are in place with all posts having been offered to

these panels.

CHO DNCC have introduced continuous rolling recruitment campaigns for difficult to fill specialities including Physiotherapy, Nursing, and Dietitians while also working with

recruitment agencies to source candidates from the local & international market.

The recruitment team have introduced new initiatives to market and attract new candidates including moving recruitment campaigns to a new user friendly applicant software, local Refer a Friend Scheme, presence at Health Care Jobs Fairs, and advertising jobs in specialty publications such as union newsletters, local newspapers and professional body

websites. Vacancies are also advertised on CHO DNCC social media platforms.
