To ask the Minister for Health the number and percentage of patients who waited 0-6, 6-9, 0-9, 6-24, and 9-24 and 24+ hours for admission via an emergency department for each emergency department in October 2019, in tabular form. The numbers for all patients and for patients aged over 60 years and for those over 75 years; and if he will make a statement on the matter.

Dear Deputy Cullinane,

The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question, which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response.

In order to support HSE consistent monitoring across all sites, it is important that Patient Experience Time (PET) reports and aligns with HSE key performance indicators/targets. These targets are within time and age bands respectively. This information is published by BIU/HSE and used to manage and drive performance improvement.

PET targets are monitored and reported in context of time bands and age bands as follows:

## **Time Bands**

- 6 Hours
- 9 Hours
- 24 Hours
- Greater than 24 Hours- Please note that all patients waiting greater than 24 hours are included within this time band and could include patients waiting for longer time periods.

## Age Bands

- All attendances irrespective of age
- Those aged 75 years and over



In this regard, I can provide the information for all admissions and those aged >75 years in the attached excel template.
