**\*To ask the Minister for Health the number of persons with diabetes who are awaiting a first appointment to the adult outpatients diabetes clinic in any of the UL Hospitals Group hospitals; the number of persons waiting for time periods (details supplied) in tabular form; and if he will make a statement on the matter. - Joe Carey**

**\*To ask the Minister for Health the process that is employed by UL Hospitals Group in moving persons from the waiting list to the adult out-patients diabetes clinic list; the way that the waiting list is monitored; and if he will make a statement on the matter. -Joe Carey**

Dear Deputy Carey,

The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Questions which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response.

The below table outlines the number of patients waiting for a first appointment at UL Hospitals Group for the diabetic outpatient service:

0-3 months	83

In addition, please see below the process employed by UL Hospitals Group in moving persons to the outpatient diabetes waiting list:

- Upon receipt of a GP referral the patient is added to the waiting list
- A doctor triages the referral as AAU (Admission Avoidance Clinic), urgent, soon or routine

- AAU & urgent referrals are taken off the waiting list and an appointment date is issued as a matter of priority
- Soon and routine referrals remain on the waiting list until an appointment date can be issued
- If a patient's GP is concerned and the patient's symptoms have deteriorated since the first referral was sent, an updated referral should be sent to UL Hospitals Group for triage

We have made positive progress recently in recruiting staff for our adult diabetic services. Following successful recruitment campaigns, a Consultant Endocrinologist commenced post at University Hospital Limerick in May 2022. An additional Consultant Endocrinologist is also due to take up post in October 2022.


The Adult Diabetes Service is also supported by a dedicated team of Clinical Nurse Specialists (CNS) and Staff Nurses. Four Diabetic CNS posts have been approved for University Hospital Limerick. Following recruitment campaigns, all four Clinical Nurse Specialists are now in place. There are also three Diabetic Staff Nurses in post at University Hospital Limerick.

University Hospital Limerick recently became a DAFNE accredited centre. Staff training is currently taking place. We anticipate that this programme will commence in Q4 2022.

Developing our diabetes services continues to be a core focus for UL Hospitals Group and we are committed to improving this service for our patients.
