Dear Deputy Murphy,

The Health Service Executive (HSE) has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question (PQ 51491/22) which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response.

There exists a recently developed but yet to be clinically approved national guideline on postnatal care in the public health service. This contains a series of mental health screening questions to screen for depression and anxiety.

The public health nurse will ask all mothers these screening questions. These questions can be repeated at the 3-month assessment and are validated for use up to 12 months post-delivery.

It is expected that the national guideline will be approved before the end of Q4 2022.
