Re: PO 45025/22 – “To ask the Minister for Health the position regarding podiatry services provided by the HSE in Co. Clare; the status of the service going forward; the number of persons on the waiting list for the service; and if he will make a statement on the matter”.

Dear Deputy McNamara,

The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in regard to your parliamentary question which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response. I have examined the matter and the following outlines the position.

The Podiatry Services Manager has confirmed that HSE Podiatry Services in Co. Clare are provided through five community clinics. These clinics are based in Ennis, Ennistymon, Shannon, Kilrush and Scariff. The podiatry service is provided by two Senior Podiatrists and one Staff Grade Podiatrist. Recruitment of an additional Staff Grade Podiatrist is currently being processed.

The Podiatry Services Manager has confirmed that all community clinics are operational. She has also advised that the service remained operational throughout the pandemic and priority patients were seen in a clinical setting. The government restrictions and Infection Prevention Control guidelines had an impact on their capacity to see non-urgent cases which has resulted in a waiting list backlog.

The Podiatry Services Manager confirmed that there are currently 620 patients waiting to be called for their first appointment and there are 3,432 patients on the active database.

The Podiatry Services Manager also advised that when the new Chronic Disease Management Hub becomes fully operational in Co. Clare there will be additional podiatry posts attached to the hub and the majority of patients with Diabetes will then transfer to the Chronic Disease Hub.

I trust this information addresses the issues raised in your representation.
