Dear Deputy Hourigan,

Thank you for your above correspondence which has been referred to me for response.

The HSE utilises Microsoft (MS) technology extensively across its Digital estate. 95% of Core server infrastructure runs on MS technology, and the equivalent percentage of end user computing devices 99%.

Microsoft is therefore a key strategic technology partner for the HSE. The HSE run and manage the largest ICT environment (excluding IT companies) in the country & it is one of the most complex digital estates in the country. Staying modern in a complex environment requires significant resources and expenditure.

The HSE provide over 87,000 end user devices, 5,000 servers, and 44,000 mobile phones. We also support 2,000+ applications and have over 1,300 network sites.

Since we run a 24/7 service, the associated Microsoft contracts must support this service.

As we move to cloud services, the Microsoft costs will increase year on year.

In 2022 the expenditure is €8 million, which is equivalent to €92 per device.

The table in Appendix 1 attached details each of the contracts from 2018-2022.
