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Dear Deputy Tóibín,

The National Cancer Control Programme (NCCP) only has access to a small subset of data related to specific tumours. However, the National Cancer Registry of Ireland (NCRI) has a statutory obligation to collate information in relation to cancer incidence, prevalence, stage at diagnosis, treatment, survival and mortality. This type of information will normally only be finalised and made available 2 to 3 years after the year of incidence, in keeping with international standards. The NCRI annual statistical report for 2022 has incidence data for 1994-2020 and can be downloaded from the NCRI website at:
