**PQ 7150/23 – To ask the Minister for Health the steps he has taken to ensure that children with long Covid have access to appropriate, up to date assessment and treatment in the public health system, including access to appropriately expert consultants; and if he will make a statement on the matter**

Dear Deputy Murphy,

The Health Service Executive (HSE) has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question (PQ 7150/23) which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response.

The HSE Interim Model of Care (MoC) for Long Covid was finalized in September 2021. On the back of this, an expert subgroup was set up under the office of the CCO to develop this MoC and was led by the National Lead for Integrated Care, with input from different stakeholders. Extensive literature reviews were conducted in relation to the prevalence of Long Covid, risk factors, symptoms profile and trajectory and approaches to treatment.

There was a paucity of research in children, with initial reports indicating that children recover quickly from Covid and that the incidence of Long Covid was very low in these populations. For children and young people suspected of having Long Covid, the diagnosis and care is therefore provided by GPs and General Paediatricians.

The National Clinical Programme for Paediatrics and the National Clinical Advisors and Group Leads (NCAGL) for children and young people will continue to work closely with the HSE Long-Covid team to review evidence and support access to care.
