PQ Question: To ask the Minister for Health the budget allocated to CAMHS as a percentage of the health budget and the overall budget from 2017 to 2022, and to date in 2023; and if he will make a statement on the matter. -Mark Ward

Dear Deputy Ward,

The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question, which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response. I have examined the matter and the following outlines the position.

The table below provides detail on the Mental Health budget for CAMHS from 2017 to 2022. Please note the allocation of funding for 2023 is not currently available, as the National Service Plan for 2023 is not yet finalised.
