Dear Deputy Shanahan,

The Health Service Executive (HSE) has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Questions, which were submitted to the Minister for Health for response.

I have reviewed the matter and the following outlines the current position.

Persons with medical card eligibility and other eligible persons can access dental treatment through the Dental Treatment Services Scheme (DTSS). All medical card holders are entitled to specific dental treatments: dental examination, two fillings in each calendar year, extractions as necessary.

An updated list of participating dentists in the DTSS Scheme in Waterford can be obtained by contacting the Primary Care Unit in Lacken, Kilkenny on 056 7784234 who will provide assistance in this regard.

Currently the number of dentists that hold contracts for the DTSS in Co. Waterford is 19 within 11 practices.

Over the past three years the number of dentists that have withdrawn from the DTSS Scheme in Waterford is 22, the relevant Principal Dental Surgeon and the Primary Care Reimbursement Service (PCRS) are advised of all exits.


Unfortunately there is no pathway for the HSE to ensure Dentists accept medical cardholders as patients. The HSE issues the contracts and requests yearly registration documentation but the HSE cannot direct a dentist to offer an appointment to a medical card patient. It is a matter for the individual dentist to decide the clinical priority of patients reviewed within their surgeries i.e. existing or new patients.

A recent Circular (Circular No. 13/22) was issued to Dentists informing them of changes and fee adjustments/increases effective from 1st May 2022 which may increase the numbers of dentists applying for a DTSS contract.

There are particular issues with the HSE Dental Service for adults i.e. DTSS. This is a nationwide problem and not unique to Co. Waterford. A number of private general dental practitioners (GDP) have resigned from the scheme and many general dental practitioners still operating the scheme have restricted access and may only be seeing existing patients. SECH understands that matter is currently being raised and considered by the Department of Health and the HSE at a national level.
