To ask the Minister for Health the number of children awaiting a psychology appointment in CHO1; the breakdown of the time they have been on the waiting list; and if he will make a statement on the matter.

## **Dear Deputy Naughten**

The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question, which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response. I have examined the matter and the following outlines the position in Community Healthcare Cavan, Donegal, Leitrim Monaghan and Sligo.

The below table provides a breakdown of the number of children awaiting psychology appointments in Community Healthcare Cavan Donegal Leitrim Monaghan and Sligo (CH CDLMS).

The referral rates, and waiting times, for the Primary Care Child Primary Care Service have increased since the reconfiguration of the Children's Disability Network Teams (CDNTs) and the corresponding introduction of the National Access Policy (NAP) in 2021. Children with autism, whose presentations are less complex under NAP scoring but for whom differential diagnosis is complex are now referred to the Primary Care Child Psychology Service. However, the capacity of the Primary Care Child Psychology Service in CH CDLMS has not increased to meet this additional demand

Currently, there are 716 children waiting for Psychology appointments with Primary Care Psychology Cavan Monaghan, with 269 children waiting over 52 weeks. The longest waiting



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time is 130 weeks. The waiting times are being impacted staff vacancies (3 posts) which are under recruitment and an increased referral rate. On average, the service receives over 40 referrals for children every month. This referral rate has increased by almost 50% for the same time period (January – May) 2021.

Currently there are 230 children on the waiting list for Primary Care Psychology Services in Donegal. The referral rates and waiting times, for the Donegal Primary Care Psychology Service have increased since the reconfiguration of CDNTs and the implementation of the National Access Policy in Donegal, in July 2021. Prior to this, all children with autism, or a possible diagnosis of autism, were referred to the Disability Services. The Donegal Psychology team have managed the additional demand as efficiently and effectively as possible. New pathways of care have been introduced in order to comprehensively meet the needs of this particular group of children and evidence based approaches are also employed.

Currently, there are 190 children on the waiting list for Primary Care Psychology Services in the Sligo/Leitrim/ South Donegal area. Approximately 30% of these children have been offered best practice group based psychological intervention and will require additional individual intervention in due course. The longest waiting time for an individual appointment is 98 weeks.
