## Dear Deputy,

I refer to your recent Parliamentary Questions which was sent to the HSE for response.

The HSE can advise processing is completed on 86% of claims received, Total paid to date (22/03/2023) is €51.2 million, approving payment to 55,816 employees. Organisations approved for payment per cohort are as follows;

Cohort 3 Agency and Contractor packs were received later than other cohorts as contractor packs were issued later, contractors had more supporting evidence to compile and agencies have a larger number of employees and employee locations to collate.

It is not possible to confirm how many persons are awaiting payment as claims continue to be received from employers on a daily basis and no deadline has been set by HSE for employers to submit their claims. The team is fully committed and is processing claims as quickly as possible.

The Government has expressed sincere gratitude to all healthcare workers for their efforts during what has been a challenging period for our health services. The Department appreciates that those who do not qualify for this particular payment may feel disappointed, and that they too have made a significant contribution to the State's response to the pandemic but it was a difficult decision to set the boundaries here.

I trust this clarifies and is of some assistance.
