To ask the Minister for Children; Equality; Disability; Integration and Youth the current vacancies within the children's disability network teams in New Ross, County Wexford; the number of posts assigned to this team; the current status of the vacant posts; and if he will make a statement on the matter.

Dear Deputy Murphy,

The Health Service Executive (HSE) has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question, which was submitted to the Minister for Health for response.

I have reviewed the matter and the following is the current position.

The approved staffing for CDNT-Network 8 New Ross is 11.05 WTE and the current vacancies are outlined in the table below:

CDNT-8 (New Ross)	
Vacant Posts	WTE
Senior Social Worker	1.00
Clinical Nurse Manager 2	0.80
Dietician	1.00
Children's Disability Network Manager	0.75

As with other areas Disability Services within South East Community Healthcare (SECH) are continuing to experience significant recruitment challenges. The HSE is operating in a very competitive market as there are significant shortages of qualified healthcare professionals nationally and internationally.

South East Community Healthcare continues to express posts out to current national panels and continues to prioritise local recruitment campaigns.

The HSE acknowledges that waiting times for CDNT service at this time are stressful for children and their families, and will continue to explore a range of options to enhance the recruitment and retention of essential staff into our CDNTs.
