Dear Deputy Shortall,

The Health Service Executive (HSE) National Ambulance Service (NAS) has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Questions, which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response.

The Brady and Flaherty - *Review of Arrangements for the Provision of the Emergency Ambulance service in the Dublin Region* was co-commissioned by Dublin City Council (DCC) and the Health Service Executive (HSE) in response to a review by the Health Information and Quality Authority (HIQA) in 2014.

The HSE understands that the subsequent report, which was finalised in 2016, was the subject of an industrial dispute within DCC resulting in the report not proceeding to publication or full implementation. In this context, the HSE can advise as follows:

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The Minister for Housing, Local Government and Heritage and the Minister for Health have agreed to establish a Task and Finish Group, the scope of work which includes:

- an agreed implementation plan for the location of emergency ambulance call-taking and dispatch;
- a Governance Framework for a service delivery model (organisational and clinical);
- an agreed recoupment mechanism whereby the HSE recoup appropriate costs to Dublin City Council for the operation of DFB's ambulance service; and
- the process to be time bound with regular reports on progress to both Ministers
