Deputy Bacik,

Thank you for your question to the Minister for Health, which was forwarded to my office to respond to you directly.

A range of holistic supports are available to people living with HIV through Public HIV Clinical services and community NGO partners.

As part of the HIV Fast-Track Cities Initiative¹, the HSE Sexual Health & Crisis Pregnancy Programme (SHCPP) is conducting a HIV Scoping Study, to review the current HIV care and support services available for people living with HIV, and to document the challenges and gaps. The report will be available in the coming months, and the findings will inform future service plans.
