Dear Deputy Shanahan,

The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the following parliamentary question, which was submitted to this department for response.

PQ: 13477/23

To ask the Minister for Children; Equality; Disability; Integration and Youth the status of funding presently being provided to UHW and to CHO5 to provide a community neuro-rehabilitation team (details supplied); the number of whole-time equivalent positions and the specialisation of each, between acute hospital service and community service, respectively; and if he will make a statement on the matter.

Details Supplied: The Implementation Framework (2019-2021) for the National Neurorehabilitation Strategy calls for the urgent need for community neurorehabilitation teams to be provided to community health organizations in Ireland including to CHO5 which has an ever increasing need for dedicated services at University Hospital Waterford

HSE Response

The Programme for Government – 'Our Shared Future' - includes a commitment for advancing neuro-rehabilitation services in the community. The Health Service Executive is leading on the implementation framework in respect of the recommendations of the National Policy and Strategy for the provision of Neuro-Rehabilitation Services in Ireland 2011-2015.

The Neuro-Rehabilitation Strategy Implementation Framework (IF) was launched in February 2019.

The overarching aim of the Strategy is the development of neuro-rehabilitation services to improve patient outcomes by providing safe, high quality, person-centred neuro-rehabilitation at the lowest appropriate level of complexity. This must be integrated across the care pathway, and provided as close to home as possible or in specialist centres where necessary. These services are to be configured into population based managed clinical rehabilitation networks (MCRNs). The overarching aim is the development of population based MCRN's around the country.

Two demonstrator projects within CHO6 and CHO7 were established to assess the feasibility of the model to inform national roll-out. As part of this demonstrator project there is funding for two Community Neuro-Rehabilitation Teams, one in CHO 6 and one in CHO 7. The aim is that these teams will be recruited and operational in 2023. The plan moving forward is to roll out



these networks of Neuro-Rehabilitation Services nationally. In line with this, an additional two teams will be introduced in CHO 2 and CHO 4 in 2023.

There has been no funding to date provided through the Neuro-Rehabilitation Strategy to UHW or for a Community Neuro-Rehabilitation Team in CHO 5. Within CHO 3 and CHO 1, there are Community Neuro-Rehabilitation Teams that pre-date the strategy. There is currently no Community Neuro-Rehab Team operational within CHO 2, 4, 5, 8, 9, however, moving forward with the strategy, the plan will be to create a population-based Community Neuro-Rehabilitation Team within each CHO, or RHA following the implementation of the new Regional Health Areas within Sláintecare.
