Dear Deputy Higgins,

The Health Service Executive (HSE) has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question (PQ 14931/23) which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response.

The HSE, as an organisation, aims to provide a continuum of care for service users across the health system. In relation to Speech and Language Therapy (SLT) services, we are aware that parents at times seek private SLT assessments and interventions while waiting for public services or to supplement what they may be already receiving.

When assessing and treating a child, HSE SLTs will review and consider any relevant assessments in the context of their own professional judgement, assessment, knowledge of the child, situation and the services they believe are required and are available at the time.

I trust this is of assistance.
