PQ 15591/23: To ask the Minister for Health the total annual spend on CervicalCheck in each of the years 2018, 2019, 2020, 2021 and 2022; and if he will make a statement on the matter.

Dear Deputy,

I refer to the Parliamentary Question above.

About CervicalCheck

Cervical screening is free to all women and people with a cervix aged 25 to 65 who live in Ireland. You do not need to wait for an invitation to book a test. Women can check the register at hse.ie/cervicalcheck and book a test when it is due.

- If you're between 25 and 29 years of age, you will usually have a cervical screening test every three years.
- If you're between 30 and 65 years of age, you will usually have a cervical screening test every five years.

CervicalCheck: annual spending figures

The total annual spend by CervicalCheck in each of the past five years is shown in the table below.

Cervical cancer elimination
