Dear Deputy Murphy,

The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary question, which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response. I have examined the matter and the following outlines the position.

Six of the Hospital Groups have provided data in response to this PQ, please see below;

## **ULHG**

The nursing staff WTE for the Neurology Department in UHL is 7.5 WTE.

In relation to the second part of your PQ which asks about plans to engage with the HSE with a view to the provision of increased capacity and resourcing in this specialist area, the National Clinical Lead of the Neurology Programme has advised of the following;

The National Clinical Leads Programme in Neurology is working closely with the HSE to develop services across the country, aligned with the aspirations of SlainteCare. Specifically, the programme has worked with the National Pathways programme to enhance access for those with neurological conditions, with additional resourcing in 2023 for Headache, Epilepsy and Motor Neuron Disease. Additional pathways are currently in development.

The programme is also working closely with the National Neurorehabilitation Programme to improve rehabilitation services, and the National Dementia Strategy for those with cognitive and behavioural decline.

The Programme envisages a "Hub and Spoke" model of care for those with neurological disability, and is seeking to develop services across 10 Neurology sites, such that each Neurology Centre has full capacity to deliver integrated neurological care for the majority of those within their catchment area. For rare / complex neurological disorders, the Programme envisages the development of networked tertiary /quaternary centres of excellence, with appropriate likes to regional centres and integration with community care services.

I trust the above is of assistance.
