## Re: PQ 20851/23 To ask the Minister for Health the number of critical care beds currently provided in each public/voluntary hospital, in tabular form.

Dear Deputy O'Callaghan,

The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary question, which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response.

I wish to advise you that, at end April 2023, the critical care funded capacity is 323 critical care beds available. Table 1 below provides the requested detail regarding the Critical Care Beds in each public/voluntary hospital.
