Dear Deputy Sherlock,

The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary question, which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response. I have examined the matter and the following outlines the position.

Reasons for leaving employment in the HSE are currently not collected centrally, therefore we are unable to answer your query regarding the number of radiographers that have transferred to the NHS during the requested timeframe or those that plan to transfer.

I have attached a file containing details of the turnover rate for radiographers for the period Q4 2022 & Q1 2023, which is the most recent data available. This information is broken down by Hospital Group as it is not available at hospital level; turnover rate is provided as opposed to number of leavers as requested as that data is not available.

I trust the above is of assistance.
