* To ask the Minister for Health the out-of-hours mental health services that are currently available in County Roscommon*

Dear Deputy Smith,

The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response. I have examined the matter and the following outlines the position;

Community Healthcare West Mental Health Services provides support to people in the Community 9-5pm Monday to Friday by referral from the persons GP. In emergency cases if a person is in Crisis outside of the core business hours they should in the first instance be seen by a GP through Westdoc, who will then make a determination on the most appropriate course of action, i.e. presentation at A&E, presentation to the Acute Unit Roscommon County Hospital or referral to the local Community Mental Health Team for assessment. If an individual or family member is unsure what to do they can ring the Acute Inpatient Unit for advice on the best course of action and may in extreme crisis circumstances be advised to attend the Acute Unit for assessment by the NCHD on Duty. The number for the Unit is 0906632325. I am enclosing for your information a leaflet on other available services throughout Roscommon which may be useful.
