Re: To ask the Minister for Health the number of diagnoses of HIV, gonorrhoea, chlamydia, syphilis, pubic lice and HPV in each of the past five years, in tabular form; and if he will make a statement on the matter

Dear Deputy Bacik,

I refer to the above Parliamentary Question which has been referred by the Minister for Health to the Health Service Executive for direct response.

Please find below data on the annual number of diagnoses of HIV, gonorrhoea, chlamydia and syphilis from 2018 to 2023 (up to 15/10/2023).

Table 1 provides the annual number of diagnoses of HIV, gonorrhoea, chlamydia and syphilis from 2018 to 2023 (up to 15/10/2023). This data is correct at time of publication but is subject to ongoing review and validation. Public lice and HPV are not notifiable diseases in Ireland therefore HPSC cannot provide information on these diseases.

Notes:

In January 2021, a pilot project on free home STI testing was launched in three countries (Dublin, Kildare, Wicklow) for those aged 17 years and older living in Ireland. Additional counties were included over time, and free home STI testing has been available nationwide since October 2022. The service aims to improve access and

capacity for STI testing and diagnostics for chlamydia, gonorrhoea, syphilis and HIV (with some users offered a hepatitis B and C test as required). This increased capacity for STI testing likely led to better case ascertainment and could in part explain the recent increases in STI notifications in Ireland. In 2022, HIV diagnoses increased considerably compared to previous years, with 884 diagnoses during 2022. However, it is important to note the majority of HIV diagnoses in 2022 are in those who were previously diagnosed outside Ireland (where history of previous diagnosis is known). People with a previous HIV diagnosis are included in the national data as it is their first diagnosis in Ireland. However, it is important to distinguish between people who were previously diagnosed from those who were not, in order to understand the epidemiology of HIV in Ireland and the impact of prevention campaigns.
