Re: PQ 45873/23 To ask the Minister for Health how many people have died in Ireland from an illness (details supplied - AIDs) per year from 2014 to 2021 inclusive, in tabular form; and if he will make a statement on the matter.

Dear Deputy Ring,

I refer to the above Parliamentary Question which has been referred by the Minister for Health to the Health Service Executive for direct response.

Acquired immunodeficiency syndrome (AIDS) is not a notifiable disease in Ireland and HPSC does not collect information on every new diagnosis of an AIDS defining illness. It is therefore not possible for HPSC to ascertain how many people have died in Ireland due to an AIDS-defining illness.

HPSC collects information on every new Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) diagnosis that is made as HIV is a notifiable disease in Ireland. As part of the data collection process, additional data are requested from the clinician including whether the case had an AIDS-defining illness at the time of their HIV diagnosis and whether they died at the time of their HIV diagnosis<sup>1</sup>. As the data are limited to the time of HIV diagnosis, any subsequent AIDS defining illnesses or a change in outcome (i.e. death) are not routinely reported to HPSC. Table 1 below provides a summary of information that is captured on CIDR (Computerised Infectious Disease Reporting system) that may be relevant to this query.
