PQ Question: To ask the Minister for Health the number of people in each LHO area waiting for a counselling appointment in primary care as of 1 April 2024 or the latest date available; and the number waiting less than 6, 6-12, 12-18 and more than 18 months. -Jim O'Callaghan

## Dear Deputy O'Callaghan

The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question, which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response. I have examined the matter and the following outlines the position.

The HSE National Counselling Service established Counselling in Primary Care (CIPC) service in July 2013 as a mental health initiative to provide counselling to adults experiencing mild to moderate psychological difficulties who present in the primary care setting. CIPC receives an average of 17,000 referrals per annum. More than 170,000 people have been referred to CIPC since it was established with an average of 2,060 clients attending at any time.

All adults in receipt of a medical card are currently eligible for the service. Access is by referral from the client's GP or a member of the Primary Care Team. CIPC is available in each community health area and is accessible from over 240 locations, mainly primary care centres, situated throughout Ireland.

Waiting times for CIPC vary across the country depending on referral rates, service delivery model, staffing levels and individual geographic factors. CIPC is a demand led service with the counselling contract offered based on the assessed needs of the client. As the number of clients seeking counselling exceeds the number of counselling spaces available at any one time there is a waiting time for counselling.

The table below indicates the latest available information for the number of people waiting for the HSE NCS Counselling in Primary Care Service. Figures are provided by CHO, LHO and length of time waiting for the time periods less than one month, one to 3 months, 4 to six months and more than 6 months. A breakdown of waiting list information for 6-12, 12-18 and more than 18 months is not available.



Of the total number of people waiting (4939), the majority (51%) are waiting 3 months or less for counselling. 16% of people currently on the waiting list have been waiting longer than 6 months.
