All new referrals are discussed weekly at the Multi-Disciplinary Team meetings and given an appointment date based on clinical need. The majority of urgent referrals will be seen within 1-2 weeks. Every effort is made to prioritise urgent referrals so that young people with high risk presentations are seen as soon as possible and this is often within 24hrs and/or 1 week. It should be noted that urgent new referrals impact on wait times for cases that are considered, by a clinician, to be of a less severe nature.
