Dear Deputy Moynihan,

The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you with information in the context of the above Parliamentary Question which you submitted for response. I have examined the matter and the following outlines the position.

The Central Remedial Clinic (CRC) is a non-residential national service established for the care, treatment and development of children and adults with disabilities.

- CRC are the National Lead Agency for five Children's Network Disability Teams, the teams are located at Clontarf, Balbriggan, Swords Waterford and Clondalkin.
- CRC deliver Specialist Services from the core locations of Clontarf and Waterford. Specialist outreach services are provided by the Clontarf team, in partnership with local service locations and HSE teams in other areas.
- Limerick and Clondalkin locations provide Assistive Technology & Specialised Seating services.
- Adult day services are provided from several local centres and community hubs which, except for Firhouse, are all based in North Dublin locations.

Total 2025 funding allocation to the CRC amounts to €27,197,134.

I trust this information clarifies this matter for you.
